## **Equity Pricing**

It is the goal of the Seminar to create an environment for all handspinners to meet and share their love and knowledge of the craft. It moves around the province in order to be more accessible and in this spirit, we are trying to incorporate an equity pricing model.

In these models, those who cannot afford to pay the full amount of registration are offered a lower price. It incorporates the honour system so people do not have to disclose their personal information and no one is judging whether someone deserves a lower price. For the 2022 Seminar, we are able to offer 5 registrations at the reduced cost of \$55.


#### **Volunteers**
