Fall 2013 Newsletter

On June 27, 1964, seventy-five spinners from all over Ontario and neighbouring states gathered at the farm of Edna and Wes Blackburn. It was the first event of its kind in North America. The program that day included demonstrations of sheep shearing, fleece sorting and scouring, vegetable dyeing, fibre preparation, and spinning with spindles and various types of spinning wheels. Organized by Edna Blackburn, Ted Carson, and Dorothy Kirk, the meeting was such a success it was decided that the Ontario Handspinning Seminar should become an annual event.

The 2014 Committee is hard at work planning a very special program for our 50th anniversary celebration, one that will be enjoyable and informative for all spinners, from beginner to advanced. This year's program will be organized a bit differently from previous years. There will be opportunities to participate in many hands-on activities, and everyone will have a chance to try them all. The program will include a rare opportunity to view the Kirk spinning wheel collection, and to work with several of the wheels.

The Best Western Inn on the Bay is located on the waterfront in downtown Owen Sound, and is easily accessible by car. Parking is free at the hotel, so no parking passes are required. There is Greyhound bus transit to Owen Sound from Toronto via Barrie.

The Saturday program will take place at Grey Roots Museum and Archives, just a short drive from the hotel. We will provide signs and other support for those who wish to drive to insure that you find your way to the museum without difficulty. You will not be required to bring you spinning wheels for the Saturday program (but do pack your spindle if you have one), so it will be easier to car pool. There is ample, free parking at the museum. Shuttle bus service will be arranged for those who require it.

Accommodations

A block of hotel rooms has been set aside for our use. The hotel rooms are \$134.99 plus taxes per room – no matter what size the room is. There are a number of single rooms (1 queen-size bed and 1 pullout sofa) and a number of double rooms (2 queen-size beds) reserved for us. There is **no** surcharge for extra people in the hotel room (up to 4 people per room). Breakfast is **not** included in the room cost.

Award Winners

Founders Award: Dorothy Hinchcliffe. This award honours the founders of the Ontario Handspinning Seminar: Edna Blackburn, Ted Carson and Dorothy Kirk. The award of \$100 is presented to the person with the best article on display, made of 100% handspun yarn. It is judged by the Seminar attendees, who cast ballots for their favourite.

Barb Patterson Award: Karen Fowler. This award of \$25 honours Barb Patterson, one of the founding members of The Grand River Spinners and Weavers Guild. It is presented for the "Best Skein by a Novice Spinner".

Ontario Handweavers and Spinners Award: Betsy Walters. This award of \$100 is presented by the Ontario Handweavers and Spinners. The award is given in recognition of the article on display that demonstrates "the best use of handspun yarn in a handwoven article". Judges are provided by the Ontario Handweavers and Spinners.

Handweavers' Guild of America Award: Beth Abbott. This award of a gift certificate and handwoven ribbon is presented by the Handweavers' Guild of America in recognition of "a work of hand weaving, spinning, dyeing or basket-making which embodies a unique interpretation, demonstrates a fresh, individual approach and expresses personal creativity", as judged by an appointee of the Ontario Handspinning Seminar Board of Directors.

WOW!! Award: Bridget Lewis. This award of \$50 is judged by the Ontario Handspinning Seminar Display Coordinators. It is in recognition of an article that inspires the viewer to say "WOW"!! All articles submitted for display are eligible.

Re-inspired Spinner Award: not presented. The purpose of the award is to allow the individual to further their education and re-inspire them by attending a workshop, class or course that is of interest to them. A cash value of \$250 will be awarded to the successful applicant.

New to the Seminar Awards: Kate Michalska & Susan Reeder. This award will go to the first two people to register as first time attendees. The award will be the registration fee along with \$50.

The Edna Blackburn Award: Yvonne Hugli. This award will be presented to a novice spinner (less than 2 years experience) for a 100% handspun article. This annual award will be for the amount of \$50. The award will be chosen by the judges from the current Seminar, and awarded by the Committee Chair.

The Handspinner's Research Scholarship

The Ontario Handspinning Seminar Inc. has money available for an annual Scholarship that is to be used in the exploration and development of new techniques, equipment and/or related research of interest to handspinners and dyers. A specific plan of study must be included with the application. Recipients are required to share the results of the experience with the participants of an Ontario Handspinning Seminar within 3 years of receipt of the scholarship.
