2017 Baggie Challenge...

Start thinking about what you will create using last year's baggie challenge fibres. Bring your creation to the seminar and let us all see what you have made! A prize will be awarded for the best baggie challenge item (or skein) as voted by the attendees.

Here is last year's challenge again:

In your baggie, you found fibres from the workshops given in 2016. Play with them! **Your challenge** is to create a playful, unusual **item** or **skein** from the fibres given. You <u>must use at least some of every fibre</u> in your baggie. You <u>may</u> use additional fibres from your stash if you wish.



2017 Competition and Awards...

New this year, we are opting to **omit all competition** (except for the Founder's Award – chosen by seminar attendees' votes). We hope this will encourage each and every one of you to bring something you have created this past year to show us. No judgement—just an opportunity to see the creativity in each of us and to support each other's efforts.

We will still have a ballot for everyone to choose their favourite item in the display: the Founder's award! This award honours Edna Blackburn, Ted Carson and Dorothy Kirk who established the first Handspinning Seminar gathering in 1964. Participants vote, recognizing the best article on display made from 100% handspun.

As you ponder and explore spinning projects between now and June 16, 2017, set aside some items to share at the seminar. Participants will be asked to contribute no more than 1 item per category (4 categories for skeins and 3 for projects).

Skeins: There are 4 categories: 2 ply, 3 ply, novelty, spindle spun

Projects: Garments (sweaters, vests, jackets, shawls, etc);

Accessories (slippers, hats, socks, mittens, scarves, cowls etc.);

Other (dolls, tea cozies, placemats, decorative and household items etc.).

More specific details will be included in the Spring Newsletter and posted on the website.



Coach's Corner...

There will be an opportunity to sit down with an experienced spinner and get some feedback about a particular aspect of your spinning. What might you be interested in asking about? Novelty yarns? Singles? Plying? Effectively matching handspun to a project? More details to come...

2017 Fashion Show:

We expect this should be a highlight of the 2017 Seminar, since so many of you will be bringing your newly crafted items for display. You will be asked for details of your piece when you bring it in so that the announcer will be able to describe each piece fully.

Scholarships...

The Ontario Handspinning Seminar organization has developed two different scholarships; the Ontario Handspinner's Research Scholarship and the Re-Inspired Scholarship. Detailed information and application forms are available on the website (http://ontariohandspinningseminar.weebly.com/scholarship.html).

The Handspinner's Research Scholarship: The Ontario Handspinning Seminar Inc. has funds available for an annual Scholarship to be awarded and used for the exploration and development of new techniques, equipment and/or related research of interest to handspinners and dyers. A specific plan of study must be included with the application. Recipients are required to share the results of their experience with the participants of an Ontario Handspinning Seminar within three years of receipt of the scholarship. Those interested are encouraged to apply before the January 31st deadline.

Re-inspired Spinner Scholarship: The purpose of the scholarship is to allow the individual to further their education and knowledge of handspinning in order to re-inspire them in their craft. This is to be accomplished by attending a workshop, class or course which pertains to spinning or dyeing handspun fibre or other related areas. A cash award of up to \$250.00 will be given to the successful applicant. The applicant must send their application to the secretary of the Board of directors at seminarsecretary@gmail.com by January 31st, a description of the intended course or workshop they would like to take and a description of what they hope to learn from it. The recipient is required to share the results of the experience with the participants of The Ontario Handspinning Seminar within 2 years of receipt of the scholarship. This can be done by a short oral presentation or visual display in a format in which they are comfortable.
